## Abstract

Young Men's Buddhist Association (YMBA) and some other associations were formed since the time of British Colonial rule. Some of them paid attention to the religious matters since their inception. But YMBA is the one which laid stress on the religious matters only after gaining independence. Though it involved in the political activities in the colonials days, YMBA plays a leading role in the religious activities after 1948.
